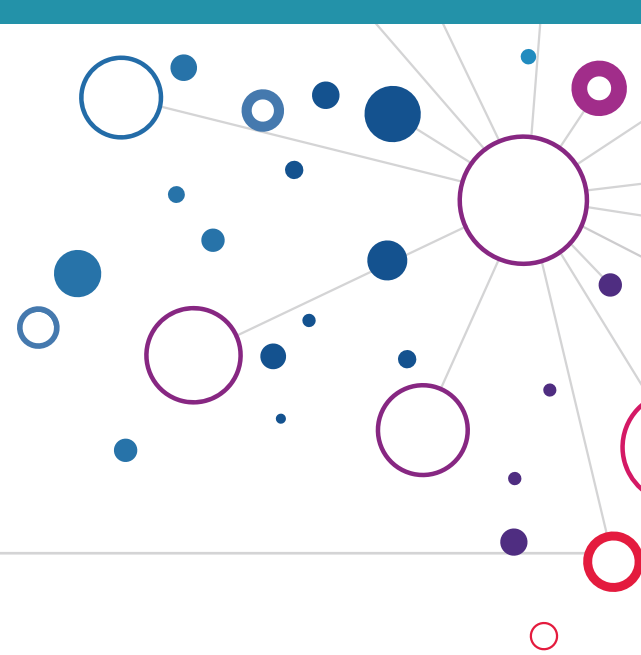

He also holds certificates in nonprofit board consultancy and nonprofit board education through BoardSource.
